

## 12.7 Field Soccer (Friday, Saturday and Sunday)

Field soccer will be played on Friday (17:00-22:00), Saturday (09:00-19:00) and on Sunday (09:00-16:00) on multiple soccer field on the campus of the University of Twente.

1. A maximum of one men's and one women's team can be enrolled per OSSO/education institution. A team consists of a minimum of 11 and a maximum of 16 persons for both men and women.
2. The team of an OSSO may only consist of students who meet the conditions set out in chapter 1 of the event's regulations of the SSN. If this rule is violated, the team loses all matches.
3. If an unauthorized participant participates in the GNSK, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the OSSO for which that participant competes. Also, the results of the team in question will be cancelled.
4. The men and women play their matches on alternating artificial grass and normal grass. Which matches are played where will be announced in advance.
5. The teams must be present and ready to play at the time indicated in the tournament schedule. If the team is not present at the given time, the team loses the game. The result is then 3-0 in favor of the team present.
6. The poule will be based on a draw.
7. The matches last 2 x 20 minutes with 5 minutes rest and 5 minutes warming-up. In the break there will be a change of half.
8. A won match scores 3 points, draw 1 point and lose 0 points.
9. It is allowed to substitute during the games. Players can therefore be substituted several times in a single match.
10. If a player receives a yellow card, a time penalty is imposed and he/she must leave the field for five minutes.
11. If a player receives a red card (or two yellow ones), he/she must leave the field and is suspended for the next match.
12. If in a pool teams end up with an equal number of victory points, then the mutual result decides. If it is not possible to reach a decision in this way, the goal balance and then the number of goals will decide. If no decision is reached either, 5 players of each team take one penalty kick each. If no decision is made after this, the penalty series continues until one team has scored one goal more than the other team, after each team has shot an equal number of penalty kicks. Per series of penalty kicks, the goalkeeper may not be replaced unless he/she has been injured.
13. When several teams have achieved the same number of points, the mutual result between the teams concerned determines the final ranking in the rankings. If this does not offer a solution, the goal difference will be taken into account.
14. Each team must take care of its own linesmen, according to the game schedule.
15. If a match in the knock-out phase ends in a draw, it will be extended by 2x5 minutes. If necessary, penalty kicks will be taken.
16. Match balls will be provided. Balls for warming up must be brought along by the teams.
17. As far as no exception is made in the above points, the regulations of the KNVB are in place.
18. In all cases, the soccer committee reserves the right to make a binding decision.
19. The arbitrators shall be independent.
