

12.11 Hockey (Saturday)

Hockey is played on Saturday (09:00-18:00) on the hockey field of the University of Twente.

1. A maximum of one men's and one women's team can be registered per OSSO/educational institution. The minimum number of players/players per team is 7. The maximum number of players/players per team is 12.
2. An OSSO's team may only consist of students who meet the conditions set out in chapter 1 of the SSN's Events Regulations. If this rule is violated, the team loses all matches.
3. If an unauthorized participant participates in the GNSK, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the OSSO for which that participant competes. Also, the results of the team in question will be cancelled.
4. Team assignments must take place before the first game of the team is played.
5. Each team must bring two different colours of shirts that are clearly different from each other.
6. The games will be played on half field with a maximum of 7 players including a goalkeeper with full goalkeeper equipment.
7. At each game two referees will whistle. The referees that are in charge during the match, apply the rules and assess whether the teams play fair.
8. Normally, a goal only counts if the ball has been touched by an attacker in the circle and the ball has completely crossed the goal line. As half pitches are played on, markers will be placed on the pitch at a reasonable distance from the goal from where the circle begins.
9. A penalty corner will be played the same way as indoor.
10. High balls are allowed, as long as they are not dangerous according to the usual KNHB rules.
11. A match time will be 25 minutes. In the pool phase a win will be judged with 3 points, a draw with 1 and a loss with 0. In a decisive match, there will be no prolongation, but direct shoot-outs.
12. Players must ensure safety for themselves and other players at all times. Should an umpire consider that a player does not meet this requirement, the player may be sent off the field by the umpire. Should the GNSK committee find that this has not been corrected during the remainder of the tournament, the committee reserves the right to disqualify the player from the tournament.
13. As far as no exception is made in the above points, the KNHB regulations are in force.
14. In all cases, the hockey committee reserves the right to make a binding decision.
