

12.15 Table tennis (Saturday and Sunday)

Table tennis will be played on Saturday (10:00-18:00) and on Sunday (10:00-15:00) in the sports centre of the University of Twente.

1. A maximum of one team can be enrolled per OSSO/educational institution. A team consists of a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 5 players. There is no restriction on the number of women and men in the team.
2. The team of an OSSO may only consist of students who meet the conditions set out in chapter 1 of the SSN event regulations. If this rule is violated, the team's results will be cancelled.
3. If an unauthorized participant participates in the GNSK, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the OSSO for which that participant competes. Also, the results of the team in question will be cancelled.
4. Team rosters must be submitted before the first game of the team is played.
5. The pooling is based on the average ELO-rating. The pools will have an equal strength level, as far as this is possible.
6. Teams are expected to be present at least 15 minutes before the start of their match.
7. All players must keep score for their own games and forward the results towards the committee.
8. The game is played according to NTTB rules. This means 11 points per game and a "best of 5".
9. Per game between two cities 3 players will play. The teams indicate in advance which player is playing on which position (1, 2 or 3). Then the game takes place in the following order of play: 1-2, 2-1, 3-3, 1-1 and finally 2-2. In the pool phase, all matches are always played out.
10. In case of a draw in the pool phase, the mutual results will be taken into account.
11. Wearing approved sportswear (guidelines from the NTTB) is mandatory. White shirts and shorts and/or sports shoes with releasing/black soles are not allowed.
12. Gluing is not allowed in the playing accommodation.
13. At this tournament special bat checks may take place on the use of unauthorized glue and/or rubbers. In case of improper use, the organization can take measures. For the checks, the guidelines from the ITTF will be used.
14. In all cases the table tennis committee reserves the right to make a binding decision.
