

12.6 Tennis (Friday, Saturday, Sunday)

Tennis is played on Friday (17:00-22:00), Saturday between (09:00-19:00) and Sunday between 09:00-16:00 on the tennis courts of the University of Twente.

1. A maximum of one team can be enrolled per OSSO/educational institution. A team consists of a minimum of 4 persons, namely 2 men and 2 women and a maximum of 8 persons, namely 4 men and 4 women. It is recommended to come with more than 4 persons, given the number of matches to be played.
2. The team of an OSSO may only consist of students who meet the conditions set out in chapter 1 of the SSN event regulations. If this rule is violated, all the team's match results will be removed.
3. If an unauthorized participant participates in the GNSK, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the OSSO for which that participant competes. Also, the results of the team in question will be cancelled.
4. Teams must report to the committee and the line-up 15 minutes before the start of the competition. In case of late attendance (at the discretion of the tournament management), the party present will have won all matches against the city in question 5-0.
5. Per team match: 1 ladies single, 1 men single, 1 ladies double, 1 men double, 1 mixed double.
6. The pool division is based on a draw.
7. The maximum warm-up time on the field is 5 minutes.
8. Until the finals shortened games will be played (2 sets, starting each set with the score 0-0). At a score of 1-1 in sets, a super tiebreak is played to decide who has won the game. The result will then be such that the winner has played a third set and won 7-6.
9. The finals consist of regular games (2 sets won).
10. The games for 3rd and 4th place are also played according to the regular rules (2 sets won).
11. Per pool the team that has won the most games will be judged. In deviation, the team that has won all team games ends first.
12. In case of a tie, the balance of the games won and lost is taken into account. If it is also a tie, the balance of won and lost sets is taken into account. If it is also a tie, the number of games won and lost is taken into account. If this is also equal, the mutual results will be used.
13. Participants must bring shoes that are suitable for playing tennis. In advance, in the game schedule, it will be published what kind of surface will be used.
14. As far as no exception is made in the above points, the KNLTB regulations apply.
15. In all cases the tennis committee reserves the right to make a binding decision.
