Regulations Basketball

- Per member city/student sports board, a maximum of two male- and two female teams can
 be subscribed. The first subscribed team is always allowed to join. Based on the amount of
 courts as well as the amount of subscribed teams the committee will decide whether there is
 space for second teams to participate. If so, second teams will be placed via subscription
 order.
- 2. A team consists of minimal 5 and maximal 12 persons.
- 3. Each team of a member city/student sports board can only consist of students who meet the requirements as described in chapter 1 of the event regulations of SSN. In case that this rule is violated, the particular team will automatically lose all games in which this rule is violated with a score of 20-0.
- 4. When a participant who is not allowed to play according to the requirements, still plays at the GNSK, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the member city/student sports board which this participant represents. In addition to this, all results of the concerning team will be declared invalid.
- 5. The composition of the teams has to be reported to the commission before playing the first game.
- 6. The teams have to be ready to play at the time that is indicated on the game schedule. In case that one of the teams is not present at the indicated time, this team will lose the game. The resulting score will then be 20-0 in favour of the team that is present.
- 7. The placement of teams in the group stages is done at random (raffle).
- 8. The duration of a game is determined at 30 minutes, of which the last 3 minutes are continuous playing time (clock stops when the ball is not live). The final will consist of 2 x 15 minutes of continuous playing time.
- 9. Winning a game is rewarded with 2 points. In case of a tied game during the group stage, each team will get 1 point. If at the end of the group stage teams end up with the same amount of game points, the results of their mutual game will determine the ranking. In case that this also result in a tied situation, the difference between total points scored and total points allowed will be determining. If this still result in a tied situation, 5 players of each team will take a free throw to determine the end result. If necessary, this procedure will be repeated until the end result is decided.
- 10. Every team is allowed one timeout per game, in which case the game clock will continue (in principle). Only if a timeout is taken in the final 3 minutes, the game clock will stop.
- 11. Substitutions are only allowed in dead ball situations (after a whistle is blowing by the referee).
- 12. Game balls will be provided by the commission, but balls for the warming-up have to be brought along by the teams themselves.
- 13. If a player receives 4 personal fouls, he or she will be excluded for the remaining part of the game.
- 14. During the group stage, the foul penalty applies from the 8th team foul.
 - a. From the 8th team foul onwards, every defensive foul will result in one point and ball possession for the opposing team.
- 15. The final consists of 2x15 minutes continuous playing time (game clock only runs when the ball is live). Per half (15 minutes), the foul penalty applies from the 5th foul.
 - a. From the 5th team foul onwards, every foul will result in two free throws.









- 16. During the final, personal fouls will be punished according to the NBB rules.
 - a. A player that receives 4 personal fouls will be excluded for the remaining part of the game.
- 17. Every technical, disqualifying or flagrant foul or foul in the act of shooting will be punished with 1 point and ball possession for the other team.
 - a. In case the foul is made on a scoring player, the points of the score will be awarded plus 1 point bonus.
- 18. A technical or flagrant foul result in exclusion for the remaining part of the game.
- 19. A disqualifying foul result in exclusion for the rest of the tournament.
- 20. During the group stage a tied end score is allowed. In the knock-out phase (after the group stage) a tied game will result in an overtime of 5 minutes. If this also does not result in a winner, 5 players of each team will take 1 free throw to determine the end result. If necessary, this procedure is repeated until one of the teams wins.
- 21. Teams are expected to bring along reserve shirts or have reversible shirts (with a different colour than the original jerseys). If necessary, the team that is secondly mentioned on the schedule will play in the reserve shirts.
- 22. Protests with regard to decisions made by the referee will not be accepted.
- 23. Aside from exceptions mentioned above, the rules of the NBB will apply throughout the tournament.
- 24. In all cases, the commission has the right to make a binding decision if necessary.
- 25. Regularly, teams will have to take care of the jury table at other games, given they do not play themselves. These duties will be presented on the game schedule.

File a protest:

Protest must be submitted up till one hour after the end of the match.

Participants or teams can file a protest against other participants/ teams based on eligibility and competition rules. Decisions of referees or other officials cannot be challenged, nor can the regulations of the GNSK, the regulations of the camping and other articles from the event regulations of Studentensport Nederland.

To file a protest, the teams have to do the following:

- The sports committee must be notified of the protest as soon as possible after the end of the match, during which the alleged violation has occurred.
- The person to be called: to be determined
- The protest must be signed by an official representative of the team and must contain the following elements:
 - Date, time and location of the incident
 - The relevant article which was violated
 - A description of the situation
 - The names of the protesting team/participants, signed.

On Saturday, the protests will be processed at the end of the day. On Sunday, the protests will be processed no later than two hours after the protest has been submitted. All protests must be dealt with before the start of the finals.
