## **Regulations Powerlifting**

- 1. Each member city/student sports board student sports organization is allowed to register multiple participants for powerlifting.
- 2. A participant may only be a student that applies to chapter 1 of the event regulations of SSN. When this regulation is violated, the participant loses all competitions. If a ineligible participant participates in the GNSK competition, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the member city/students sports board of the participant. Besides, the results of the participant will be taken out of the rankings.
- 3. Maximum amount of participants to the tournament is 100.
- 4. Registration is based on the principle of first come first serve.
- 5. Registration for the powerlifting event needs to be done through following site: www.powerliften.sport
- 6. Rules and regulations are according the KNKF and the international powerlifting federation. The regulations will be followed unless otherwise stated by the organization.
- 7. The participant needs to be a member of the KNKF as well being registered as student in the powerlifting section. For more information please check: knkf-sectiepowerliften.nl/leden/lidmaatschap

## File a protest:

Protest must be submitted up till one hour after the end of the match.

Participants or teams can file a protest against other participants/ teams based on eligibility and competition rules. Decisions of referees or other officials cannot be challenged, nor can the regulations of the GNSK, the regulations of the camping and other articles from the event regulations of Studentensport Nederland.

To file a protest, the teams have to do the following:

- The sports committee must be notified of the protest as soon as possible after the end of the match, during which the alleged violation has occurred.
- The person to be called: to be determined
- The protest must be signed by an official representative of the team and must contain the following elements:
  - Date, time and location of the incident
  - The relevant article which was violated
  - A description of the situation
  - The names of the protesting team/participants, signed.

On Saturday, the protests will be processed at the end of the day. On Sunday, the protests will be processed no later than two hours after the protest has been submitted. All protests must be dealt with before the start of the finals.
