Regulations Volleyball GNSK 2023

Competition rules

Team Composition and eligibility to play:

1. Per member city/student sports board, a maximum of two male- and two female teams can be subscribed. The first subscribed team is always allowed to join. Based on the amount of courts as well as the amount of subscribed teams the committee will decide whether there is space for second teams to participate. If so, second teams will be placed via subscription order.
2. Each team consists of a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 players.
3. Each team subscribed by the member city/student sports board may only consist of students who meet the requirement conditions as described in chapter 1 of the SSN event regulations. Violation of this rule will lead to the elimination of the respective team from the rest of the competition.
4. If an ineligible participant participates in the GNSK, a fine of 200 euros will be charged to the member city/ student sports board the participant represents. Additionally, the results of the team in question will be deleted.
5. The team composition needs to be made final before the team plays its first match.
 - a. If an OSSO is allowed to subscribe two teams, the players are not allowed to switch between the teams and cannot play a match for the other team. If this happens, article 4 counts.

Competition rules:

6. Matches will be played according to the rules “Spelregels 2022-2023 - Eredivisie” described by the NeVoBo
7. Match shirts need to be numbered according to the regulations of the Nevobo as well as the color of the libero match shirt.
8. The former team on the match schedule is the ‘home’ playing team.
9. The aim is to arrange referees from the NeVoBo for every match. If this cannot happen, non-playing teams must, according to a schedule, nominate players to referee at matches.
10. The aim is to arrange as many counters as possible for the matches. If this cannot happen, the ‘home’ playing team is responsible for arranging counters.
11. The committee will arrange the match balls. Balls for the warming up need to be arranged by the teams themselves.
12. Before every match, teams have 10 minutes to warm up at the net. Where possible, the areas at the top of the stands can be used for warming-up without a ball.
13. The use of notes for the team setup (opstellingsbriefjes) is obligated.
14. The teams must be ready to play at the time indicated in the game schedule. If one team is not present at the specified time, the respective team loses the match. In case of a group-phase match, the respective team loses the match with 2-0 (sets: 25-0) and in the case of a

final, the respective team loses the match with 3-0 (sets: 25-0), all in favor of the team present.

Group phase:

15. The distribution of the poules in the group-phase will be determined according to a draw.
 - a. Exception: when a member city/student sports board is allowed to subscribe two teams, the respective teams will be separated in the group-phase.
16. The matches in the group-phase will be played according to the best-of-three system, of which any third set will be played according to the rules applied to a regular fifth set.
17. A 2-0 won match will give the winners 3 match-points, A 2-1 won match gives the winners 2 match-points and the losers 1 match-point.
18. The ranking of the poules will be determined based on the points the teams earned during the matches of the group-phase.
19. In the event of an equal number of points in a poule of the group-phase, the following will be decided consecutively:
 - a. The quotient of the amount of sets for and against in all played matches;
 - b. The quotient of the amount of points scored for and against in all played matches;
 - c. The amount of match points scored in a head-to-head match.
 - d. The quotient of the amount of sets for and against in a head-to-head match.
 - e. The quotient of the amount of points scored for and against in a head-to-head match.
 - f. If the result is still equal after this, a decisive set is played in accordance to the rules that apply to a normal third set.

Following-up round, semi-finals and grand final:

20. The follow-up round will be determined according to the amount of subscribed teams and amount of poules in the group-phase.
21. The follow-up round and semi-finals will be played as well according to the best-of-three system described in article 17.
22. The grand final will be played according to the best-of-five system.

Final provisions:

23. Protests will not be accepted when they concern arbitral decisions.
24. When there are no exceptions made in the above points, the regulations of the NeVoBo (Eredivisie) apply.
25. In all cases, the committee reserves the right to make a final decision.

File a protest:

Protest must be submitted up till one hour after the end of the match.

Participants or teams can file a protest against other participants/ teams based on eligibility and competition rules. Decisions of referees or other officials cannot be challenged, nor can the regulations of the GNSK, the regulations of the camping and other articles from the event regulations of Studentensport Nederland.

To file a protest, the teams have to do the following:

- The sports committee must be notified of the protest as soon as possible after the end of the match, during which the alleged violation has occurred.
- The person to be called: *to be determined*
- The protest must be signed by an official representative of the team and must contain the following elements:
 - Date, time and location of the incident
 - The relevant article which was violated
 - A description of the situation
 - The names of the protesting team/participants, signed.

On Saturday, the protests will be processed at the end of the day. On Sunday, the protests will be processed no later than two hours after the protest has been submitted. All protests must be dealt with before the start of the finals.
