# Regulations Tennis

1. Each member city/students sports board is allowed to register a maximum of 4 teams, two men and two women teams. Each team will consist of a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 4 athletes.
2. Each team of a member city/student sports board may consist exclusively out of students that fulfil the conditions as mentioned in chapter 1 of the event regulations of SSN. Violating these rules will result in deleting all achievements made during the GNSK.
3. If an ineligible competitor participates in the GNSK, a fine of €200,- will be charged to the concerned member city/students sport board for which the competitor takes part. Furthermore, the results of the team will be deleted.
4. The teams will have to register 15 minutes prior to the match at the competition secretariat and pass along the line-up. When a team fails to do so, the team that is present will have won all matches with 5-0.
5. Per team the following matches will be played: 2x single and 1x double. Men and women will have their own competition.
6. The group distribution will be based on a draw.
7. The maximum time for the warming-up is 5 minutes.
8. Up and till the finals, short matches will be played (2 sets will be played with each set starting at a score of 0-0). When a match end in 1-1 (in sets), a super tiebreak will be played to decide which team has won. The result will be noted down as 7-6 for the third set in favour for the team that won the super tiebreak.
9. The finals will be played as regular matches (the first that has won 2 sets).
10. The matches for third and fourth place will also be played as regular matches (the first that has won 2 sets).
11. For every group, the team that has won the most matches will be announced as the winner for that group. If deviation were to happen, the team that has won all team matches will be announced as first.
12. If a tie were to happen, the balance between won and lost matches will decide who wins. If this would be equal as well, the balance between won and lost sets will decide who wins. If this also is a tie, the balance between won and lost games will decide who wins. If this is also equal, the result between the tied teams will decide who wins.
13. Participants should bring shoes that are suitable to tennis with. The type of court used will be announced beforehand in the match schedule.
14. Insofar as no exception is made in the above points, the regulations of the KNLTB are in place.
15. The tennis committee of GNSK 2023 will have the right to take a binding decision in every occasion.

## File a protest:

**Protest must be submitted up till one hour after the end of the match.**

Participants or teams can file a protest against other participants/ teams based on eligibility and competition rules. Decisions of referees or other officials cannot be challenged, nor can the regulations of the GNSK, the regulations of the camping and other articles from the event regulations of Studentensport Nederland.

To file a protest, the teams have to do the following:

- The sports committee must be notified of the protest as soon as possible after the end of the match, during which the alleged violation has occurred.
- The person to be called: *to be determined*
- The protest must be signed by an official representative of the team and must contain the following elements:
  - Date, time and location of the incident
  - The relevant article which was violated
  - A description of the situation
  - The names of the protesting team/participants, signed.

On Saturday, the protests will be processed at the end of the day. On Sunday, the protests will be processed no later than two hours after the protest has been submitted. All protests must be dealt with before the start of the finals.
