# Regulations Table Tennis

## ***Individual Tournament***

1. Per member city/student sports board multiple athletes can be registered. Based on the number of registrations there will be a groups phase first, which will be followed by knock out.
2. Players must be students who meet the conditions as stated in chapter 1 of SSN's event regulations. In case of violation of this rule, the player concerned will lose all matches in which this rule has been violated.
3. If an unauthorized participant competes in the GNSK, a €200 fine will be charged to the member city/student sports board for which that participant competes. Also, the results of that player will be deleted.
4. During the GNSK 2023 there is an individual tournament for men as well as an individual tournament for women.
5. Until the semifinals matches are played via the 'best-of-five' principle. Semifinals and medal matches will be played via the 'best-of-seven' principle. A game is won by the players who first reaches 11 points with at least two points difference.
6. In principle, no judges will be arranged for these games. It is expected that players keep track of the score during the match or arrange their own judges. The organization will provide judges for the finals.
7. Group distribution will be made by drawing lots.
8. During group phase players will receive one point for each match won. If players end up with an equal number of matches won, the total number of games won minus the number of games lost will be considered. If players then still finish tied then the total number of points won minus the number of points lost will be considered.
9. The organization will provide match balls for each match. These must be returned to the sports committee after the match.
11. The players must be ready to play at the time indicated in the tournament schedule. If not, the match will be declared lost in favor of the player present.
12. Players must wear appropriate sportswear. Shoes with black soles are not allowed.
13. As far as these competition regulations do not provide, the regulations of [NTTB](#) are in force.
14. In all cases, the Sports Committee reserves the right to make a binding decision not similar to the above.

## File a protest:

**Protest must be submitted up till one hour after the end of the match.**

Participants or teams can file a protest against other participants/ teams based on eligibility and competition rules. Decisions of referees or other officials cannot be challenged, nor can the regulations of the GNSK, the regulations of the camping and other articles from the event regulations of Studentensport Nederland.

To file a protest, the teams have to do the following:

- The sports committee must be notified of the protest as soon as possible after the end of the match, during which the alleged violation has occurred.
- The person to be called: *to be determined*
- The protest must be signed by an official representative of the team and must contain the following elements:
  - Date, time and location of the incident
  - The relevant article which was violated
  - A description of the situation
  - The names of the protesting team/participants, signed.

On Saturday, the protests will be processed at the end of the day. On Sunday, the protests will be processed no later than two hours after the protest has been submitted. All protests must be dealt with before the start of the finals.
