

Regulations City Ranking GNSK 2025

1. The city ranking is determined by adding up the points obtained in all sports.
 - a. The number of points obtained per sport is based on the number of participating cities and the final ranking in that sport. See table below:

b. If multiple cities end up in the same final position, they both get the points of that position.

For example: in a sport with 15 participating cities, if 2 cities tie for 8th place, they both get 198 points. The next city will collect 154 points.

2. If there are multiple disciplines within a sport or multiple teams from the same city participating, a final position per city within the respective sport must be determined.
 - a. The final position per sport is determined by adding up the points earned by the different teams from the same city and/or in the different disciplines. See table below:

b. If multiple teams end up in the same final position, they both get the points of that position.

c. If the sport also offers individual disciplines, the above table applies, but the points are halved. For example: in an individual discipline with 12 participants, if someone finishes 3rd: $10 / 2 = 5$ points.

3. This article applies to all official sports at the GNSK and does not apply to demonstration sports.

Example

Team Nijmegen achieves 3rd place in badminton with 16 teams participating. In addition, 2 men and 2 women participate in the individual tournament, which consists of 8 participants for both men and women. The men finish 3rd and 4th, while the women finish 2nd and 8th.

Nijmegen earns 15 points for the team tournament. The individual men earn $10 / 2 = 5$ points and $7 / 2 = 3,5$ points. The individual women earn $14 / 2 = 7$ points and $1 / 2 = 0,5$ points. In total, Nijmegen earns $15 + 5 + 3,5 + 7 + 0,5 = 31$ points.

This gives Nijmegen the 2nd final position in the sport of badminton with 12 cities participating. This results in 297 points for Nijmegen in the city ranking.
