

Medaltable - City ranking GNSK 2026

1. General

1. The city rankings of the GNSK are determined on the basis of a classical medal table, in accordance with the guidelines of the Olympic Games.
2. Only official NSK events count towards the medal table and thus towards the city rankings.
3. The NSK designation is granted only to events in which:
 - a. for individual events, at least fifteen participants from a minimum of six different cities have competed;
 - b. for team events, at least six teams from six different cities have competed.
4. Demonstration sports and events that do not meet the definition of an official NSK do not count towards the medal table.

2. Medal Table and Ranking

1. The city rankings are determined based on the following order:
 - a. the number of gold medals per city;
 - b. in the event of an equal number of gold medals: the number of silver medals;
 - c. in the event of an equal number of gold and silver medals: the number of bronze medals.
2. If cities remain completely tied after applying the criteria listed in Article 2.1, they will share the same position in the final ranking.

3. Medals: Allocation and Valuation

1. No distinction is made between:
 - a. team events and individual events;
 - b. large or small participant fields, provided that the event meets the requirements of an official NSK.
2. Each official event awards a maximum of one gold medal, one silver medal, and one bronze medal per category.
3. For team events, the medal achieved is awarded to the city to which the team belongs.
4. For individual events, the medal achieved is awarded to the city to which the individual athlete belongs.
5. If multiple teams or athletes from the same city participate in a single event, a city may win multiple medals within that event, provided this is permitted under the regulations.

4. Multiple Events Within a Sport

1. If a sport includes multiple disciplines, categories, or classes (for example men/women, weight classes, or distances), each separate event counts as an independent NSK event, provided that it meets the requirements of an NSK. This excludes sports that use their own points-based ranking system.
2. Medals won in the individual events referred to in Article 4.1 are counted separately in the city's medal table.

5. Validity, Communication, and Publication

1. The organization is required to clearly communicate to participants:
 - a. which sports and events are official NSK events;
 - b. which sports and events do not count towards the medal table and therefore not towards the city rankings.
2. The official medal table is published and updated during the GNSK in the GNSK app by the organization.

6. Final Provision

1. These regulations apply to all official sports and events of the GNSK.
2. In cases not provided for in these regulations, the GNSK Committee and/or SSN will make a decision.
